7 Inspiring Saint Maximilian Kolbe Quotes That Reflect His Courageous Spirit of Faith

Be a Catholic: When you kneel before an altar, do it in such a way that others may be able to recognize that you know before Whom you kneel."



Saint Maximilian Kolbe was born in Poland in 1894, going on to become a Franciscan friar, missionary, and ultimately, a martyr of love.

Kolbe's life was marked by his deep devotion to the Virgin Mary, which led him to found the Militia Immaculatae (Army of the Immaculate), a movement dedicated to spreading devotion to Mary. His mission was to counter the prevailing secular culture of his time with the transformative power of faith and love.

However, Kolbe's most profound act of heroism occurred during World War II.In the midst of the Holocaust, Kolbe sheltered and provided refuge to countless Jewish refugees, demonstrating his commitment to protecting the oppressed and promoting human dignity. But his ultimate test came when he was arrested by the Nazis and sent to the Auschwitz concentration camp. In August 1941, a prisoner from Kolbe's block escaped, prompting the camp authorities to select ten men to be starved to death as a deterrent. When one of the selected men, Franciszek Gajowniczek, cried out for his family, Kolbe volunteered to take his place. This astonishing act of sacrificial love showcased the depths of Kolbe's unwavering commitment to emulate Christ's selflessness. For two weeks, Kolbe and the other condemned prisoners suffered without food or water. Throughout this ordeal, Kolbe's spirit remained unbroken. He even led his fellow prisoners in prayers and hymns. Saint Maximilian Kolbe's life and martyrdom continue to inspire Catholics worldwide. His example challenges believers to put their faith into action, even in the most dire circumstances! His legacy is a testament to the profound impact that one individual can have when guided by love, compassion, and an unyielding commitment to serving God and humanity. In a world often characterized by self-interest, Saint Maximilian Kolbe's story serves as a poignant reminder that true greatness lies in selfless acts of love and sacrifice.

Here are seven quotes from Saint Maximilian Kolbe that reflect his courageous spirit of faith:

"Never be afraid of loving the Blessed Virgin too much. You can never love her more than Jesus did."
